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Here we grow again: the blessings and challenges of growth

It is our constant prayer as a school community that the Lord would allow our school to grow. When we see lives being blessed, when we see research that tells us that Christian schools benefit our

society, when we see young people committing to lives of service in the kingdom of God, we want to make the blessing available to young people from as many families as possible.


For most of the years over the last decade we have been able to say that we are bigger than we thought we would be; we are now able to say that we are just getting bigger. The student population of Smithville Christian High School in the spring of 2018 is 237. The expectation for September 2018 is that we

will be above 250

Let me share a few statistics. Though our school did top out around the turn of the century at 295 students, the demographics of the last 15 years have had us considerably smaller than that, a trend echoed in secondary schools throughout most regions of Canada and the result of low birth rates through the 1990s. The chart, left, shows how student numbers have tracked since our low point in 2010.

Though birth rate is one factor in increased student numbers, there are a few other reasons:

- We see students coming from an increased diversity of elementary situations. The number of students coming to us from publicly funded elementary schools has increased sharply.
- The growth of our partner Christian elementary schools is starting to impact high school enrolment numbers.
- The percentage of students coming from these partner elementary schools has also increased over the last several years.
- The commitment our supporters make every year to building a strong bursary fund has given many families a chance to send their children to our school.

We are thrilled that God has answered our prayer for growth, and seeing more families choose our school makes us want to honour their investment with the very best we can offer. This is reflected in our strategic planning conversations. Here is a glimpse into some of those conversations:

- Building adjustments: We are blessed with good facilities, and we constantly seek ways to ensure that the learning spaces in our school connect with our desire to engage students in deeper learning. Maker spaces and collaborative spaces will be in high demand for our learners in the years ahead, while more classroom space is also necessary. The dance studio which has been rented out for several years will be converted into a classroom for next year, and our upstairs computer lab (no longer necessary) will transition into a classroom this summer.
- Plan 300: We have begun to discuss what our school should look like when our enrolment hits 300 students. It is likely that the school's next capital campaign will be for the purpose of building additional learning spaces due to increased student numbers.
- Teacher hiring: We have hired two additional teachers for next year due to increased enrolment. Hiring new teachers is always an opportunity, and as we face

the prospect of additional hiring in the years ahead, we want to be intentional about how adjustments in personnel can contribute to the diverse character of our school.

• Increases in non-teaching time: The needs of an increasing student population also bring increased time allotment in administration and student services. Changes in governance, a vibrant international program, and increased need for emotional and learning support for a diversity of students, all warrant such increases

When you pray for our school, please pray that God would allow for continued growth. At the same time, pray that we would respond to this growth in a way that allows a new generation to Belong in a supportive and caring atmosphere, to Believe in a God who is central to their whole lives, and to Succeed in a world they are called to serve with their gifts and their creativity.

As we strive to involve different generations in ongoing support for our bursary program, we are blessed with the work of the Christian School Foundation. Brené Brown is a well-known psychologist for her work on belonging. She states:

When those needs are not met, we don't function as we were meant to. We break. We fall apart. We numb. We ache. We hurt others. We get sick." Belonging matters because God created us that way.

We meet weekly and we talk about what it means to belong – we watch Ted Talks, we invite guests, we share ideas, we play games, and for 40 minutes every Monday we make the word Belong come alive.


