Christian College\University Applications: <https://www.cccu.org/>
Application Fee: varies

Although there is no specific deadline or date by which the application must be sent, it is a good idea to apply early. Many Christian universities/colleges offer fee waivers for their application if the application is completed/mailed before the end of the calendar year. The earlier you apply, the better chance you have of being considered for scholarships, financial aid packages and obtaining the residence you desire. Although the sticker price for some of these institutions may be very high, financial aid packages often make these schools comparable in price to their public competition.

Applications can be obtained online and should be sent directly to the Christian College/University by the student applying. **Students must request, in writing, to have their transcript sent to these institutions.**

Additional choices = \$50 each / International Service Fee = \$10 / Supplemental Program Fees (vary)

January 13, 2022 **Deadline** for Ontario secondary students to submit completed applications to the OUAC. Applications received after this date will still be processed and distributed, but specific university deadlines will apply.

May 27, 2022 The latest date by which all secondary students can expect a response from an Ontario university.

June 1, 2022 This is the earliest date by which universities may require a response to an offer of admission from an Ontario secondary school student.

Application Fee: \$95

Early October Colleges begin receiving applications. This is the earliest date that colleges may acknowledge applications.

November 1 Earliest date the colleges may release offers to applicants. Offers will continue to be issued until programs are filled or wait lists are established. Earliest date that applicants may confirm an offer of admission (**New 2021**).

February 1 **Equal Consideration Date:** All applications must be received and paid for on or before this date to be given equal consideration by the colleges. Earliest release of offers by the colleges to all applicants. Offers will continue to be issued until programs are filled or wait lists established. **Earliest date that applicants may confirm an offer of admission.**

May 1 The deadline for confirming offers of admission. Applicants should check their offers of admission for exact deadline dates.

June 1 Earliest date that colleges may require payment of tuition fees.

APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING

An apprenticeship is a form of post-secondary education like university or college but there's a big difference. An apprenticeship is a combination of on-the-job training and classroom learning that leads to a trade credential – or “ticket”. Apprentices not only learn skills in a classroom but also receive paid on-the-job training with an employer. GAP YEAR OPPORTUNITIES

A gap year is a break after secondary school, before making a commitment to an apprenticeship, college, university or the workplace. It can be any length of time, before and during studies, time off from work or other career pursuits and include any number of activities. You can figure out who you are, what your opportunities are, who you want to become and what you need to get there.

IELTS

If you are an international student, you may be required to provide proof of English language proficiency. The IELTS test score is recognized by more than 6000 institutions in 135 countries as a trusted and valid indicator of the ability to communicate in English.
